

## Adam Grobler

Adam Grobler is graduate in mathematics and philosophy from Jagiellonian University, Krakow. He received his Ph.D. in 1984, habilitation in philosophy in 1995, and the (national) title of professor in 2002. He taught at Jagiellonian University in 1975-2000, in 1996 he moved to Pedagogical University in Zielona Gora to be transformed into University of Zielona Gora in 2002. Since 2003 until now he teaches at Opole University.

His areas of interest include scientific method, epistemology, philosophy of language and philosophical education. More specifically, his research is focused on the questions of truth as the goal of inquiry, scientific explanation and the concept of knowledge. In his analyses he readily employs logical tools, especially the logic of questions.

He is the author of books (all books in Polish):

- *Reduction and Incommensurability* (Krakow-Wroclaw 1986),
- *Truth and Scientific Rationality* (Krakow 1993),
- *Ideas about Truth and the Way of Doing Philosophy in General* (Krakow 2001),
- *Truth and Relativity* (Krakow 2002),
- *Scientific Method* (Krakow 2006).

He is also the author of numerous papers, in Polish and English, published at home as well as in foreign journals and collections. He is known also from his translation work into Polish. He translated, among other things, selections of Hintikka, James, Putnam and books of Maritain and Sandel. At present he is the chair of Institute of Philosophy at Opole University and the chair of Committee of Philosophy of Polish Academy of Sciences.
