

Professor Dr. Edward N. Zalta

Dr. Edward N. Zalta is a Senior Research Scholar at the Center for the Study of Language and Information at Stanford University. He obtained an honors B.A. from Rice University in 1975, and a Ph.D. in Philosophy from the University of Massachusetts/Amherst in 1981.

His research specialties include metaphysics and formal ontology, epistemology, philosophy of language, intensional logic, the philosophy of mathematics, and computational metaphysics.

Zalta has published two books (*Abstract Objects: An Introduction to Axiomatic Metaphysics*, D. Reidel, 1983; and *Intensional Logic and the Metaphysics of Intentionality*, MIT Press, 1988), as well as articles in the *Journal of Philosophy*, *Mind*, the *Journal of Philosophical Logic*, *Nous*, *Erkenntnis*, the *Australasian Journal of Philosophy*, and elsewhere.

He has taught courses at Stanford University, Rice University, University of Salzburg, University of Auckland, University of Massachusetts/Amherst, University of Tasmania, and the University of Padua, and has given lectures at universities in North America, Europe, China, Japan, Australasia and the Middle East.

Zalta also designed the online *Stanford Encyclopedia of Philosophy* (<http://plato.stanford.edu/>) and now serves as its Principal Editor.
